Program Description:

Combined Degree Program status enables students to begin taking graduate level courses during the final undergraduate year, which will count toward both their undergraduate and the graduate degree requirements.

Students can only apply after completing 75 undergraduate credits, and must apply no later than the semester before the final undergraduate year.

Upon admission, a Combined Degree Credit Form must also be submitted, which lists the courses/credits the student will be permitted to double count:

- You can count a limited number of credits toward both degrees. Please see this site for the maximum number of double counted credits permitted for your degree combination:

- Only those courses for which you receive a grade of B or better will count toward your graduate degree.
- Courses that were completed (grades posted) before admission to the combined degree program will not count toward the graduate degree.
- The courses will remain on your undergraduate transcript and will be calculated into your undergraduate GPA. Adjustments will be made to the graduate DegreeMap to apply the courses to graduate degree requirements.

Students continue to be subject to undergraduate degree, enrollment, and academic standing requirements until their undergraduate degree is conferred, and must continue to consult with the CCAS Undergraduate Advising office and their undergraduate Director of Undergraduate Studies (DUS) to confirm how the courses on the Combined Degree Credit Form will apply to their undergraduate degree requirements.

Undergraduate tuition rates apply until the undergraduate degree is conferred. CCAS graduate tuition rates will apply thereafter.

Undergraduate students must be enrolled in at least 51% undergraduate-level coursework in a given semester in order to be eligible for undergraduate financial aid and many scholarships. Students must contact Financial Aid and/or their scholarship agency regarding their funding and plans for coursework each term.
